CELEBRATING BLACK HISTORY MONTH. JACK JOHNSON was the first African American boxer to win the world heavyweight championship. Johnson defeated defending champion Tommy Burns for the title on Dec. 26, 1908, in Sydney, Australia. Johnson won a technical knockout in the 14th round. He held the title until 1915.
